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To help manage peak traffic and enhance the experience for all visitors of Yosemite National Park, a reservation system will be in place during select high-demand dates.

Visiting Yosemite

- The park is open 24 hours a day, seven days a week. The entrance station to Hetch Hetchy is only open during daylight hours.
- Entrance fees are required year-round, <https://www.nps.gov/yose/planyourvisit/fees.htm>
- Permits are NOT required for day hikes within the Park, unless you are hiking to the top of Half Dome.
- Wilderness permits are required for any backpacking or camping within the Park.

When Are Park Entry Reservations Required?

If you plan to enter Yosemite between 6am and 2pm any day between June 15-August 15, a reservation will be necessary.

Driving through the park requires a reservation if entering between 6am and 2pm.

Additional reservations will be released daily, 7 days in advance of each arrival date at 8am PDT – giving you more chances to plan or go with the flow.

Outside these times, *no reservation is needed, offering you the flexibility to explore the park during off-peak hours.*

- If you are planning to visit after peak hours, please do not arrive before 2pm.
- Early or Late Entry: Enter the park before 6am or after 2pm without a reservation.
- Public Transportation: Visitors arriving via the Yosemite Area Regional Transportation System (YARTS) are also exempt from the reservation requirement. **Summer seats will require advance reservations, with a fraction of seats being available for same-day purchase.** (877) 989-2787, <https://www.yarts.com/>
- Take a Yosemite 360 Tour: led by expert local guides to help you experience iconic sights via bus or hikes - without the crowds. **Reservations required.** (559) 692-8985, <https://www.visittenaya.com/tours/>
